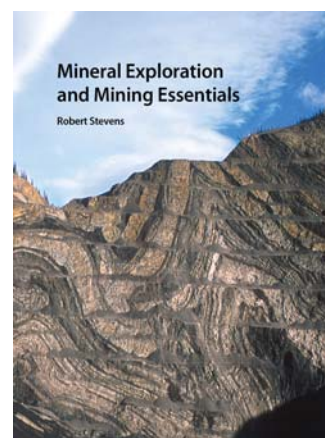

Course Overview

The course will be delivered over two days and is designed to lead participants through the entire life cycle of the mining industry with examples from the Yukon, BC and around the world. The geology and mineral deposits portion of the course introduces important concepts that allow participants to effectively understand the remaining parts of the course and industry such as drilling, mining methods and mineral processing.

Instructor Biography

Dr. Robert Stevens is a professional geologist who is well known for delivering dynamic and enlightening courses on the mineral exploration and mining industry to industry participants and stakeholders in North America. Rob is the Vice President of Regulatory and Technical Policy and the Association for Mineral Exploration BC (AME) and was previously the Director of Partnerships and Learning and the Canadian International Resources and Development Institute (CIRDI). At CIRDI, Rob was responsible for international training programs including those on environmental impact assessment, mine closure, tailings and mine water management. He has worked across Canada for a number of exploration companies and geological surveys.



Rob was a director of the AME from 2001 to 2018 and was the Chairman from 2008-2010. In 2005 he was the Executive Director of Geoscience BC; a position that involved initiating and directing Geoscience BC's programs and development in its inaugural year. In 2011, he was awarded the Association of Professional Engineers and Geoscientists of BC's premier award for professional geoscience for his significant contribution to professional geoscience. In 2013 he received the Gold Pan Award from the AME for exceptional meritorious service to the mineral exploration community. Rob is passionate about the mineral exploration and mining industry and enjoys the mix of science, engineering, business, discovery and entrepreneurialism that are integral to the industry.
